Friday, January 17 ~ **8pm** – **Jim Jones** is a native Texan, a student of the West and a life-long devotee of all things cowboy. His songwriting, guitar-picking and unique vocal style keeps him in demand on the Western music circuit throughout the Southwest. At **9:20pm** – **Carol Markstrom** is a singer/songwriter/performer of Western and folk songs. She draws inspiration from many sources, and loves to tell stories and sing about meaningful people, places, and events, including American Indian history and culture, and of cowboys and Western life. **\$8**. **Saturday evening, January 18** ~ **8pm** – **Doug Haywood** - When Doug left Phoenix at the age of 18, his plan was to have a big solo career and/or a co-operative band situation. Instead, he had a career as a studio musician, a songwriter, and a touring 'side man.' The first "side man" job was with Bobbie Gentry whose "Ode To Billy Joe" made her a household name in the late 60s...At **8:50pm** – **Mike McFadden** grew up in the Valley during the 1960s and

was the face and voice behind such Phoenix/Scottsdale bands as "The Mile Ends", "Superfine Dandelion" and "Chief Root Wizard and the Silvery Moon". In the 1980s Mike, along with the late great Mike Condello, started the legendary Los Angeles group "Eltonduck" - Mike will be performing a set of songs either about being in love, or not being in love; and more. **9:45pm – Emmett Williams** - Passionate. Honest. Raw. Emotional. Incisive. Powerful. All have been used to describe the music and performance of this singer-songwriter and award-winning artist. While his influences run the musical spectrum of punk, funk, rock, and country, he found his calling as a folksinger. **\$8.**

This poignant event at such a young age made her aware of the importance of living life to the fullest and making powerful observations about it.
